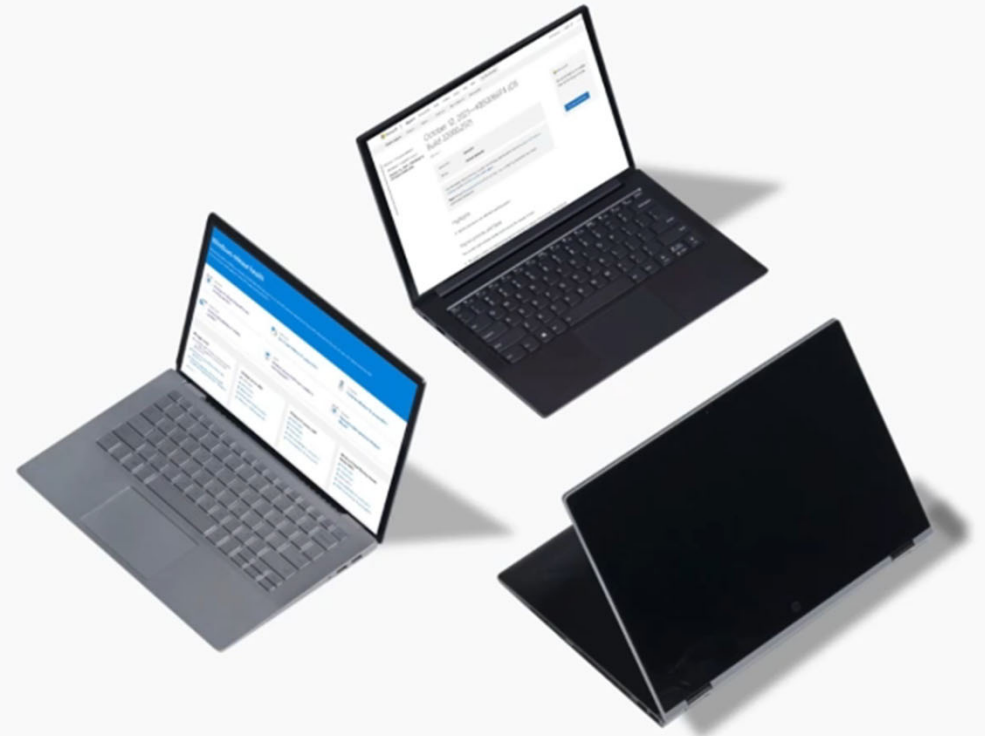

# Windows 11: release(23H2) (November 2023)

---

Windows 11 includes:

- Security updates\*
- Copilot (*preview*) for Windows AI assistant (replaces Cortana Windows virtual assistant)
- Passkeys in Windows
- Tabs for File Explorer (22H2)
- Snap Layouts, Snap Groups: (22H2)
- *Fun Feature*: New Paint App
- *Fun Feature*: Snipping Tool

# Do I need to update to Windows 11?

---

- Windows 11 was released in Oct 2021, and continues to improve each year. It also provides better security than Windows 10.
- Microsoft plans on providing Windows 10 security software updates until Oct 2025
- Due to hardware requirements, older PC's and Notebooks (manufactured prior to 2018) most likely cannot be updated to Windows 11
- According to several industry sources (not Microsoft) release of Windows 12 by fall 2024??
- As of Oct 2023

*If you are planning on staying with Windows 10 **REMEMBER TO:** check for Windows Security updates on a regular basis!*



# Windows Copilot (AI Assistant) replaces: Cortana (Virtual Assistant)



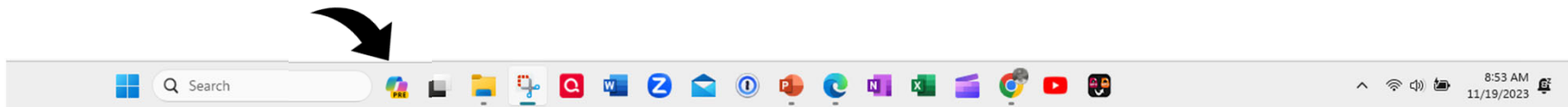
(Microsoft is a version of (OpenAI's – ChatGPT)

Copilot is the new name for the artificial intelligence (AI) assistant that Microsoft uses.

There are several different versions of Copilot, most of which are currently available only for enterprise use. There are two versions currently that are available to home users:

Windows Copilot and Edge browser Copilot, and they work independently of each other.

Windows 11 taskbar includes the Copilot Preview.



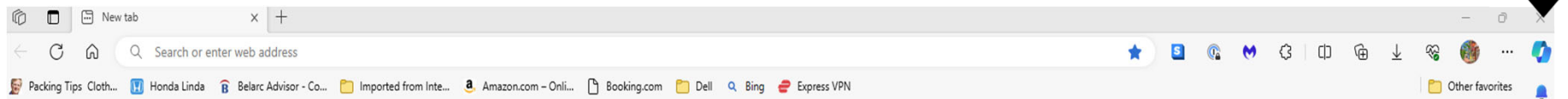
Windows Copilot (currently only in preview) accesses system settings to make changes to the desktop, such as changing to Dark or Light mode and updating Focus Time. It also currently works with a few desktop apps such as Paint (Cocreator) that is a feature of Windows 11 using the DALL-E engine from Open AI to create images.

# Copilot Edge Browser *(Bing Chat)*

---

Copilot (Bing Chat) does not interface with the computer's system settings or apps. It is accessed through the Edge browser and does not sync with Windows 11 Copilot.

The icon is located in the far-right corner of the address bar at the top of the Edge browser.



Once you click on the Copilot icon in Edge, you have several choices: Chat, Compose, and Insights. Compose is good for creating content for social media, blogs, etc. The content can be added to the desired site. Chat is good for obtaining information, summarizing the content of a page open in Edge, etc. For Copilot with Bing Chat to summarize open content, first check Edge settings to make sure this feature is enabled.
